At Dogs Trust, we love all dogs. And though we want to be able to care for any dog whose owner has passed away or become seriously ill, there are some cases where this may not be possible.

To protect the other dogs in our care, along with our staff and volunteers, we are unable to take in dogs that pose a danger to human life or other dogs in our care. Further detail can be found below:

Dangerously Aggressive Dogs

Please be aware that we prioritise the safety and wellbeing of our staff and the dogs in our care. In the unlikely event that a dog is deemed too aggressive to be safely handled, we will work closely with the dogs' guardians to decide on the kindest possible steps for the dog including, but not limited to, the option of humane euthanasia. We understand that each dog is unique, and this decision will be made with the best interest of all involved.

Banned Breeds

We are unfortunately not able to register any dogs on the banned breed list as laid out by the Dangerous Dog Act 1991, including the XL Bully. Any dogs identified as such a banned breed, even if mistakenly/falsely registered, cannot be accepted into our care. This restriction is in accordance with the law, which prohibits the transference of ownership of banned breed dogs.

Dogs from Overseas

The UK has managed to eradicate or control certain illnesses and diseases that impact the dog population. Therefore, if your dog has come from overseas or spent time overseas there may be further action or evidence needed before your dog can be accepted into a rehoming centre to prove that they do not carry any of these dangerous diseases. This is to ensure the safety of all the dogs in our care and helps us maintain disease control.
